# Clinical Waste

Used disposable items and other materials covered with large volumes of blood and or body fluids

Surgical masks

Surgical gloves

Human tissue

Closed system drains

Used dressing material

Suction bottle liners

Patient related tubing

Plastic aprons and disposable gowns

All plastic syringes used for IV drugs and pediatrics and related tube feeds (Needle must be detached)

All waste generated within isolation rooms, this will include disposable nappies (Infectious patients)

If managed appropriately, items contaminated slightly with dry blood or body fluids can be disposed of into general waste stream. Example spot of blood on cotton wool from blood test
